# Stayman I

After partner opens 1NT showing 15-17 points and a balanced hand, a 2♣ response, the Stayman convention, facilitates finding a 4-4 major fit, choosing the appropriate level and ensuring the strong hand is declarer. Generally, a major 4-4 fit scores better than NT. The 2♣ response asks opener to bid a 4-card major or deny such a holding by bidding 2♠. Both the 2♣ and 2♦ bids are artificial but so common that no alert is necessary.

#### Opener Responses After 1NT - 2♣

Opener Rebid	Meaning				
2♦	Opener lacks a 4+card major				
2♥	Opener has 4-card ♥ suit; may have 4-card ♠				
2♠	Opener has 4-card ♠ suit only				

#### Requirement

With some exceptions, here are the minimum requirements for using Stayman:

- □ 8+ points
- ☐ At least one 4-card major
- At least one short suit, i.e., a doubleton

#### Responder Rebids (8+ or 9 points)

Responder rebids 2NT without locating a 4-4 major fit; this have the same meaning and strength as just responding 2NT. Otherwise, finding a major fit, Responder <u>reevaluates</u>: (i) if holding 8+ to 9 points, rebids 3 of the major; or, (ii) jumps to the major game if Responder's hand reevaluates to 10+ points. The 2NT and 3 of a major are invitational bids; Opener goes to game if holding 16+.

## Responder Rebids (10+ points)

Responder rebids 3NT without a 4-4 major fit; otherwise finding a fit, Responder rebids game in the major. Opener removes 3NT in only one case: When holding both majors, Opener corrects 3NT to 4\(\phi\), knowing that Responder must have a 4-card major.

### Stayman with a Weak Hand (Under 6 points)

With a weak hand, there are two hand distributions with which Responder may use Stayman: when holding at least 4 cards in ♠, ♥, and ♦, which leaves zero or one card in ♣s. Note: With a weak hand and 5+cards in either major, use Jacoby Transfer and Pass.

For example, with ♠J742 ♥ Q963 ♦T942 ♠ 3 use Stayman and Pass any bid Opener makes. This is called "Garbage Stayman" and may not be used with any other distribution or strength.
