## Member's Corner getting to know... Jim Slinger

Jim grew up in rural Wisconsin, in a close knit family with great parents and two brothers. Jim's father a was successful farmer and a pillar of their community. Jim moved to Madison to attend the University of Wisconsin. He says moving from the rural Wisconsin to the urban Madison, was not a big change, but leaving home was. He was eager and ready to attend college. Jim majored in Physics, switched to Math, then to Philosophy earning his B.S. degree. He then entered the Philosophy PhD in program at UW, Madison. Jim iterates the transition from physics to math to philosophy is not unnatural or surprising. He preferred theoretical concepts to experimental research.
Jim earned his PhD in Philosophy in 1970. For 35 years (1969-2003) Jim was a philosophy professor at CSU Fresno. His primary interest is on logic and evaluating reasoning processes of all kinds, with an emphasis on the role of language in reasoning.
Jim, an avid outdoorsman, chose CSU Fresno for his philosophical career because of its proximity to the Sierras. Jim, with his climbing background, held the distinction of being the youngest person (at the time) age 14, to climb the Grand Teton by the Exum route. In 1961, Jim hiked the John Muir trail, and later, at age 70, became the oldest person in recent years to climb Kilimanjaro by the Western Breach route! CSU Fresno fit his lifestyle perfectly.
Jim says he has two avocations, the first is bridge and the second is kayaking/canoeing. Jim has made thirty plus three week long trips on arctic rivers, virtually all north of the Arctic Circle. Filmmakers from Los Angeles made a 14 minute documentary of these trips a few years ago, still accessible by googling 'Noatak: Return to the Arctic'.

Jim learned to play bridge in the college dorm. He taught himself more by reading books on bridge, than playing. His first duplicate game came in graduate school. In total, he has been playing bridge for about sixty years.
Jim met the wonderful Susan Bertken through a type of book club. Together since 1998, they married in 2006. He became a SCBC member in 2003, when Dolores Abrams was directing games.

Jim is happiest calculating the best strategy for a positive outcome of the boards. His calculations certainly have propelled him to play a fair amount of bridge at very high levels. Some of his achievements in the Main National Chaampionships, which attract the top players from all countries include: In Pairs events, he qualified for the National Finals in the North American Open Pairs 5 times, with best finishes being 3rd and 8th. In team events, Jim's team made the round of 16 in the Vanderbilts, the round of 32 in the Springold and the final 30 teams of the Reisinger. Each of these are the premier team events in the U.S.. However, Jim's most thrilling experience in team play, was winning the Sacramento Regional Sunday Swiss in 1971. Not one member on their team was a Life Master! The team went 8-0 against players who had won National Championships.

Jim's expert advice to our beginners? Number one is: HAVE FUN.
Number two is: read books. Jim recommends ACBL introductory series: Diamond, Club, Heart, Spade by Audrey Grant.
Jim's favorite and funniest story? Easy, he says, playing with a new partner in a Regional Swiss, his team was 4-3 going into the last round in the evening. Everyone was ready to go home.

Jim's partner opened 1 NT, RHO , (a particularly boisterous person), doubled. Vulnerable, Jim, with 9 HC and a 3-0-5-5 shape, heart void, bid 2 Diamonds hoping for more bidding. LHO passed, and partner bid 2 Hearts. Hmmm...., Jim realizes his partner thought he was transferring. Having values, he tried to escape, and bid 3 Clubs. Partner bids 4 Hearts thinking he was inviting to game in hearts! Jim tried again, bid 5 Clubs! Partner's bid: 5 Spades. She was headed to 6 Hearts, if not 7, and he could tolerate spades, so he passed, LHO passed, and the auction was over. All of a sudden RHO loudly bursts out- "What'? What? What's happening here?" "Well, said Jim, my partner bid 5 Spades, and it was passed out." "NO! NO!, it didn't, I DOUBLE. I DOUBLE!" [This is occurring when there are no bidding boxes and no Directors close by.] "When did you Double?" was Jim's astonished retort. "Right now! I double, I double!" she blurted. Her partner said nothing helpful except, "yes, dear". Of course, they should waited for a Director, but then it would be one word against another. Jim responded, "Well, if you have the right to bid now, I get a bid too." "Yes, Yes, of course", she said. So I bid 6 Clubs. This time my partner passed. The woman Doubled (really doubled). Jim and his partner played 6 Clubs Doubled, Vul., +1540 . First time during the round the woman was quiet. Jim says, "The only time in my life that 3 passes did not end the auction."...
