

GETTING TO KNOW....JACCI STERLING



Jacci Spanier Sterling, was born in San Francisco, and moved to Grass Valley, CA at the age four. An idyllic place to grow up a wonderful, safe community amidst scenic landscape. Jacci attended Sacramento State, studying nursing. She finished her degree at the Highland School of Nursing, in Oakland. Back home in Grass Valley, she volunteered to work in the Obstetrical Department. She found her calling, it was fun and rewarding, helping women and babies with health issues.

After marrying her first husband Tom, they had two children. Tom, working for the government, was transferred to Novato, CA and the family moved to beautiful Marin. On a whim, Jacci

stopped by the local Community hospital, inquiring about job opportunities for an OB nurse. Not only was there an opening, the Nursing Director hired her on the spot!

After she and Tom separated, Jacci met Tad. They were both avid tennis players, and married in 1984. They have a blended family with her two children and his one. They raised their family together in Novato. Jacci opened a stained glass business, (while still working at the hospital), their lives were full.

The Director of Nursing in Novato sent Jacci to Oregon for training; "The Plain Tree Program", aimed at helping medical staff provide a healing environment focusing on patient centered cared. She and her two cohorts taught EVERY hospital staff member how to provide this innovative care. A Sutter Health Care Administrator heard Jacci during one session. The administrator, impressed, offered Jacci to help start the Sutter Maternity Hospital here in Santa Cruz. Jacci was intrigued, she and Tad thought they might look at it, the children were grown, it was an amazing opportunity. Jacci became the Perinatal Director of Nursing at the brand new Sutter Maternity and Surgical Center. Jacci moved to Santa Cruz in 1995, she and Tad started living here in 1996.

Mark Wainer became Jacci's mentor, she learned so much from him.

The challenge is the part about bridge which makes Jacci happiest. She loves to "chase the carrot", make the plays and bidding better. She says she can't wait to see her hand, it's never the same. Bridge is good for your brain, she says. Jacci also likes the sociability bridge gives her.

Jacci's advice to beginners, don't take on too much at once. Slow down, while you are learning, learn the basics first and don't get too bogged down.

The funniest thing Jacci remembers about bridge happened during the NABC in Reno. Bette and David Harken, Barbara Black, and she, new to the NABCs, were unsure what team event to pay. They chose a knockout tournament team event called the Vanderbilt. At the playing area, Vanderbilt wasn't posted. They found a schedule, showing the Vanderbilts in another building. They approached a man in the lobby, asking, "Where are the Vanderbilts?" The man replied, "You are **not** Vanderbilts," and left. They found someone else who tells them, the same thing, "You are **not** Vanderbilts". Now perplexed, the four of them returned to their friends, to discover the Vanderbilts are the highest ranking knockout event and have held that distinction since 1928. No, they weren't Vanderbilts, and, furthermore, they didn't want to be Vanderbilts!
