MEMBER'S CORNER Getting to Know...

Heather MacGregor

Have you participated in the Sunday Brunch or the Newcomer's Lunch and wondered who develops and prepares these yummy menus? It's Heather MacGregor. Heather was born and raised in the East Bay. With an interest in cooking, she moved to New York to attend Culinary School. After graduating, Heather moved back to the Central Coast, and began working for Chaminade, she was their baker; at Kelly's Bakery, their cake decorator. Heather also worked for several bakeries over the hill. In 2003 an opportunity arose for her to work for Cost-Co, decorating their cakes. Since 2016, she has driven the fork-lift at Cost-Co.

Heather met her husband, Gary, a master bridge player, after she had been playing bridge for approximately five years. Of course, she knew of him, but was introduced to Gary at a regional through a mutual friend. Gary would often come to play with her at the Santa Cruz Bridge Center; members would ask her if she felt she was competent enough to partner with him. Gary and she married in 2013. He has taught her much about bridge over the years. Heather lived in both Santa Cruz and Boulder Creek from 1982 until 2003. She and Gary now live over the hill in Portola Valley.

Heather learned to play bridge from Dolores Abrams who directed the beginners, in 1993. Sherry Gilbreth and she also took bridge lessons through the Community Center, after they found a pamphlet offering bridge lessons. With friends, they began playing money bridge at each other's homes. The ante was 25 cents, and 5 cents a trick or 10 cents a trick vulnerable. It was all in fun until a big fracas ensued. An opponent on defense was looking at back tricks. Heather's partner, playing dummy, grabbed the offender's hand and said "you can't do that!" The offender, vociferated, "are you accusing me of cheating?" That's when the money game broke up and she and her partner didn't go back.

She has been a bridge player for about thirty years. She says it keeps her mind fit. Taking it off her routine and puts her focus on to thinking about the cards and solving the problem of the contract. Bridge is really good for everyone's brain, Heather says. Her advice to beginners? She says the three most important things one needs to know are, Stayman, Transfers and Negative Doubles. As well as read bridge books. We have so many books on the shelves of the Santa Cruz Bridge Club. Beginners should be looking at them, and learning the basics, (Intermediates and advanced players as well).

The first, she was defending
a hand, trying to locate
where the Ace of Clubs
was. She kept waiting for it
to be played. In the end, the
declarer's hand was short,
a card. (Declarer had not
counted her cards.) The
card was later found in the
purse of the woman who
had previously occupied
the declarer's chair!

That is a good reminder for all of us to count our cards before we look at them.

Heather's second funny story happened at a regional team game. The teams were on the third round, Having finished and compared two rounds with their teammates, Heather and her partner found their third round seats, but the opponents were occupying them. She and her partner returned to the directors table to double check they had read the seating chart correctly. After ascertaining they were indeed in the correct seats, it was discovered that the opponents didn't know what team they were on. Heather asks, how can a team compared scores from two previous rounds, and with their team but not know who their teammates are? It's truly a head scratcher....
