Getting to know...

Sue and Rich Pearce

If you play in the evenings, you've had the pleasure of meeting Rich and Sue Pearce. They can be found on the golf course during the day, as they are avid golfers. If you forget there names, Sue always says it's easy to remember, "Sue and get Rich".

Rich, born second to last of six kids, in Scottsbluff, Nebraska lived there until his father was transferred to Watsonville shortly after Rich's birth. His father was a soil engineer for the federal government. Rich attended

Morello High School in Santa Cruz; housed then at the catholic church on West Cliff Drive. After graduation, he attended UCSC. Rich married his first wife, very young, and divorced early. He became interested in construction and became a carpenter. Rich's employers promoted him to superintendent overseeing large projects. He enjoyed his occupation for thirty three years.

Sue, raised on the East Coast but born in Pittsburgh, lived with her single mom, who became single after WWII. While living in Pittsburgh, Sue's mother had many friends, two of whom, turns out, were the parents of Nancy Wainer; they all went the the same high school and palled around together.

Sue and her mom moved to Princeton NJ. Her mother found work at Gallup Inc., the multinational analytics company started by George Gallup. She remembers him as being exceptionally kind and accepting of her coming to her mother's workplace. She met many other interesting people while her mother was employed at Gallup. She met Albert Einstein but not through her mother's employment. Einstein lived down the street from a playmate, and she met him on the way home from school.

Sue met lots of astronauts as well. Sue also married young; her first husband was an engineer with the Space Program in Houston, TX. Sue and her previous spouse had three children together, but the marriage didn't last. Sue, having grown up near beaches, chose to bring her young family to Santa Cruz. Her first job was at Leask's Department Store making the window set designs. Sue worked for Leask's four years until she got a job for the State of California at the Santa Cruz Employment Development Department. She retired after twenty-five years with the state.

Rich and Sue met in 1986 after Sue moved to Santa Cruz. They became a couple in 1987. In 1994, they married and bought a house together. They have a great blended family.

Rich learned to play bridge at home and in the home of his piano teacher. His teacher and other students played together, as well as his parents, who not only played party bridge but had bridge parties. Rich and his college friends played a lot together as well. There was a Sacamento regional they attended, beating the #1 team Swiss pair of Barry Crane and his partner.

Sue learned to play bridge while living in Houston. Her neighbor, a life master, asked if she would like to learn. She accepted the invitation, utilizing his teachings and a placemat which had bidding ladders and helpful hints.

Rich's college friends enlightened Sue on his bridge prowess. They began playing duplicate bridge with Dolores Abrams in downtown Soquel. Then they started attending the Bridge Center games at the Octogon building in Capitola. Sue thinks she has been playing bridge for sixty years; Rich thinks he has been playing for fifty-five years. They joined the ACBL just prior to the pandemic. They weren't conscious of the points awards until just recently.

Sue is happiest playing bridge because it's a card game. Rich enjoys getting the top board in a game and playing the hands. They both enjoy the social aspect of bridge.

Their advice to beginners? Rich says be persistent, this game takes time, one has to keep at it. It's an interesting, difficult game. Sue says keep taking lessons; there is always something more to learn.

The funniest incident they remember was being out on the golf course after a lesson and game Ken Llacera had given and directed the evening before. The lesson was regarding leads. Ken had taught never lead away from an ace. Ken approached Sue on the golf course saying, "Sue, I saw on the boards from last night, you led away from your ace." How did he remember what I led the next day? "Won't do that ever again though", she says.
