





## ACE of CLUBs MINI -McKENNEY Annual MP Races

Did you know the ACBL conducts two year long Masterpoint competitions? The Ace of Clubs (MPs won at SCBC) and the Mini-McKenney Races. Each race is grouped into 14 categories ranging from 5 to 10,000. Players are placed into a category based on their MP total at the beginning of the calendar year.

The races are conducted on a National, District, and Unit basis. You can find your name in the list and see how you are doing compared with others in your group. Kinda fun if you're into competition.

David has been playing bridge since he was seventeen. He played a bit in college at the fraternity and then many years with Bette's brother and his wife, her parents, and friends. They all played social bridge. After retirement they took duplicate lessons in Omaha for a year. With the move to Aptos, they joined the Bridge Center. They have been members at the Santa Cruz Bridge Center since 2008.

David says he is happiest about playing bridge when his defensive and bidding strategies actually work in a game. David's advice to beginners is to learn the fundamentals.



A few years ago, David was playing in the Monterey Clambake, with his partner "Splinter Boy". The opponents of the next round were a forty-year old man and his very young partner. The partner had to sit on his knees to reach the table. David thought to himself, "this is going to be a great round for us." The partner was a youngster who made his diamond bid and played very nicely. It turned out the round was a to be a sound beating by the pair. The youngster turned out to be the youngest person to earn his Bridge Master Level at age eight! It was both a fun round and an aggravating one as his partnership was stopped in their tracks. Another bridge lesson learned "don't underestimate your opponents".
